YORKVILLE - Dorina Nelson will never forget the woman who taught her to read and write English when Nelson, an immigrant from Romania, was adjusting to life in America.

Marlyn Schaefer, a retired Ra-County cine welfare administrator, devoted an entire year to meeting Nelson inside a public library two nights a week — free of charge.



Although they were 30 years

apart in age, the two women forged a bond and became friends, as Schaefer offered other assistance to her young protege, such as cooking tips. "She was a very special lady to
